In just the past few weeks, we've launched new housing, health and financial wellness programs in Chicago. We're eager to grow our resources to reach more members of the community and establish new partnerships within the entertainment landscape of the Central Region (p. 6).

For this to be possible, we-and everyone in our performing arts and entertainment familyhave to stay as healthy as possible. With Entertainment Health Insurance Solutions and Artists Health Insurance Resource Center helping people throughout the country enroll in health insurance during open enrollment, The Fund strives to make sure people aren't missing out on crucial health care because of a lack of insurance. We also increased our free flu shot offerings to not only patients at The Friedman Health Center for the Performing Arts in New York City, but also to casts, crews and traveling family members of all Actors' Equity touring companies via our joint venture with the John Gore Organization (p. 14-15).

As we prepare to grow and change with all that 2020 will bring, we use the strong foundation from key members of The Fund's history to guide us. Former Actors Fund Trustees Harold Prince and Phyllis Newman-both of whom sadly passed away last summer-are two such figures who left their indisputable mark on The Fund. From establishing our House Seat program to focusing on senior living in California and New York, Hal was devoted to The Actors Fund for more than 50 years. Phyllis drew strength from her own health struggles to make sure women would never have to face medical concerns alone, founding The Phyllis Newman Women's Health Initiative to provide compassionate care to women in our community. The Fund was incredibly fortunate to have Phyllis and Hal as part of our family, and we will celebrate their legacies by providing the best possible care to performing artists and everyone in entertainment (p. 4–5).

Thank you as well for being a part of The Actors Fund story we're all creating. Whether you're a member of our Looking Ahead Program (p. 8-9), purchased tickets to our Special Performance of Hamilton (p.10-11), attended our Showrunners panel (p. 12-13), had an appointment at The Friedman Health Center for the Performing Arts (p.15), or joined us in any other number of ways, we're so grateful for your support and participation with The Actors Fund.

FROM OUR TRUSTEES LASTING LEGACIES

REMEMBERING Harold Prince



Harold Prince (1928-2019) was a giant in our industry, and his contribution to the history of the American theater cannot be overstated. Hal was also a genuine hero to The Actor Fund. Time and time again, Hal offered sound leadership and good counsel. His efforts have helped to build a stronger, more effective and compassionate Actors Fund.

In 1988, there was a real possibility that The Actors Fund might have to close its doors, but Hal immediately stepped up. To kick-start the rebuilding of The Fund, Hal donated his coveted house seats for *The Phantom of the Opera* to The Fund to sell to our donors. Hal's four seats inspired other Broadway shows to do the same, creating a unique membership program—what is now our House Seat Concierge Service—and a key source of financial support for our human services programs.

Hal's vision and generosity played a significant role in making sure The Actors Fund would not only survive, but prosper. He led the effort to make assisted living a vital part of The Actors Fund Home in Englewood, New Jersey, and he chaired the campaign to build The Dorothy Ross Friedman and Palm View Residences for members of the entertainment industry in New York and California.

Hal was a treasured friend who served on our Board for more than 50 years. In 2017, we honored Hal with The Actors Fund's Lifetime Achievement Award, presented to him by Joel Grey. The Gala that year also included musical tributes to Hal's incredible career from Rebecca Luker, Marin Mazzie, Emily Skinner, Bryonha Marie Parham, Gregg Edelman and Andréa Burns.

Hal's deep love and respect for everyone on stage, front and back of house, will always be an inspiration. As Board Chair Brian Stokes Mitchell observed, "As a Trustee, Hal always encouraged everyone in his orbit to support our work, ensuring yet another way his legacy in the performing arts will continue."

REMEMBERING

Phyllis Newman (1933-2019), was a beloved Trustee, member of our Chairman's Council, and founder of the Phyllis Newman Women's Health Initiative, a program of The Fund.

Over the years, Phyllis raised millions of dollars to support women in the performing arts and entertainment industry. After her own battle with cancer, Phyllis created the Women's Health Initiative to help women address the myriad of concerns they face when dealing with a serious medical condition. By coming to The Fund, they have a safe place to get confidential and compassionate help that spans individual counseling, support groups, educational seminars, references to community resources and short-term financial assistance.

Phyllis's career, on stage and off, spanned decades and mediums. She won a Tony Award in 1962 for supporting actress in a musical, and earned a special Tony, the Isabelle Stevenson Award, in 2009 for her dedication to women's health and medical care. In 2016, we celebrated the 20th Anniversary of The Actors Fund's Nothing Like a Dame benefit concert, all in support of the Women's Health Initiative. Christine Ebersole, Melissa Errico, Julie Halston, Dana Ivey, Judy Kuhn, LaChanze, Donna Murphy, Bebe Neuwirth, Mary Beth Peil, Tonya Pinkins, Carol Woods, Karen Ziemba and many more came together for a night cemented in Actors Fund history.

Brian Stokes Mitchell reflected, "Phyllis Newman was our leading advocate for women's health. She was courageous and made sure not to hide her health challenges through many Nothing Like A Dame events. She inspired us and we are proud that our Women's Health Initiative is named for her."

Central Region Programs & Services

The Actors Fund is thrilled to be growing our workshops and partnerships in Chicago!

Working closely with local partners at The University of Chicago's Arts + Public Life initiative and SAG-AFTRA, The Fund presented Affordable Housing workshops at the Kaufherr Resource Center and the new Green Line Performing Arts Center in Washington Park. These free and informative programs outlined what affordable housing is and how performing artists and entertainment professionals can search and apply for opportunities.

The Fund also provided health and wellness seminars and actitivites to those in the Windy City. We partnered with Howard Brown Health, SAG-AFTRA Chicago Local and CEILC for the Chicago Entertainment Community Health Fair, which was sponsored by the Hearst Foundation and also took place at the Kaufherr Resource Center. Attendees (union and non-union) had access to a range of free health services including flu shots; blood pressure, cholesterol and diabetes screenings; rapid HIV screenings and counseling; PReP and PEP info and counseling; dental screenings; physical therapy consultations and more. Health insurance enrollment and guidance were also available at an Every Artist Insured: Get Enrolled, Chicago free workshop.

Jaime D. Delgado, the newest member of our Central Region staff, is leading our financial wellness offerings with at least one Budgeting Nuts & Bolts workshop each month. Our Chicago office will also start Managing Cash Flow seminars in February (to run through October 2020), with plans to add at least two more workshops pertaining to money management and strategy.

Turning to The Actors Fund

For more than three decades, Jana has been a proud member of the entertainment industry. In addition to being an actress and a singer, she worked in the accounting department at a major film studio in Los Angeles to help support herself and her family while performing. And while she's retired from her desk job, Jana—at 70 years old—continues to go on auditions and act in commercials.

A proud member of The Actors Fund ENCORE group, Jana meets with her peers (aged 65 and older) on an ongoing, once-a-month basis. Together, they create a safe place to explore the challenges of growing older in "the business." Members form friendships, offer support to each other and have built a community of vibrant, creative seniors. But Jana first came to The Fund under much different circumstances. "I was in an abusive situation for many years. I didn't know what to do, and I called on The Actors Fund," Jana explains.

Our social workers met with Jana each week to provide support and guidance. However, Jana finally reached a point where she feared for her safety so much and knew she had to make a change. With determination and help from our counseling, she gathered the strength to take control of her life. Jana continues, "I didn't have the money to move out. I was in dire straits. The Actors Fund paid my rent and down payment. Without it, I would still be in that situation."

In navigating her new life, Jana continued to turn to The Fund for resources. She attended financial wellness seminars and sought advice on how to transition to retirement. She also takes computer literacy class for seniors, held at a local city college in California.



THE ACTORS FUND Flu Shot Program for Touring Companies



The Actors Fund is committed to helping everyone in our performing arts and entertainment community stay healthy all year long, especially during cold and flu season. In addition to offering free flu shots at The Friedman Health Center for the Performing Arts in New York City, The Fund is proud to partner with the John Gore Organization on the launch of The Actors Fund Flu Shot Program for Touring Companies.

The program is designed to provide flu shots to the cast, crew and traveling family members of all Actors' Equity national touring companies, as well as theatrical venue staff, while also educating them about the programs and services available to them through The Actors Fund.

Flu shots are made available at theater venues by trained pharmacists from CVS Pharmacy as scheduled by The Actors Fund. If patients are insured, the flu shots are billed to the insurer. For anyone uninsured, the John Gore Organization covers the cost of the vaccine.

"This spirit of collaboration is what The Fund is all about," said Brian Stokes Mitchell, Chairman of The Fund. "Thanks to the John Gore Organization, we're able to offer flu shots to hundreds in our community across the country. This builds on the health insurance guidance, enrollment and support we offer nationally—including care we offer at The Friedman Health Center for the Performing Arts, our medical office in New York City run in partnership with Mount Sinai Doctors. It's a real win for the health of our community."

"We're sensitive to the challenges faced by the cast and crew of touring companies moving from city to city with lack of access to their regular health care providers," said John Gore, owner of the John Gore Organization. "We are thrilled to partner with The Actors Fund to provide a free and convenient way for the casts and crews to get their flu shots on the road this season."

Since September, the program has administered more than 400 flu shots to touring companies including *Les Misérables* in Tulsa, OK; *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* in Atlanta, GA; *Hamilton*-Angelica Tour in Philadelphia, PA; *Come From Away* in Cincinnati, OH; *Miss Saigon* in Costa Mesa, CA; *Beautiful: The Carole King Musical* in Portland, ME; *Wicked* in New Orleans, LA; *Hamilton*-Philip Tour in Appleton, WI; *Hello, Dolly!* in St. Louis, MO; *Aladdin* in Durham, NC; *Harry Potter and the Cursed Child* in San Francisco, CA; and *The Lion King* in Boston, MA.
